The Spring Bluff R-XV School District will continue to take the health and safety of our students and staff seriously during this pandemic and making informed decisions for the health and safety of everyone.



The Parents as Teachers (PAT) program is a research based early childhood home visiting framework (virtual at this time) that builds strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to learn. PAT helps to establish positive partnerships between home, school. and the community and plays a vital role in supporting families and children from the very beginning toward school readiness. A trained parent educator emphasizes parent-child interaction, development centered parenting and family well-being in their work with families. The PAT program consists of four components: personal visits, group connections, screenings, and resource referrals. Together, these components provide families with children, prenatal to kindergarten entry, a program of support so that children are able to reach their full potential.

No Cost School Meals Continue Through May 2021

Spring Bluff R-XV students will be able to eat breakfast and lunch at no cost through the remainder of the school year. Our school received approval on September 18 to offer this program to all district students through an approved waiver from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

Only full trays are covered under this program All ala carte items and extra milks will be applied to student accounts as normal. This program will not cover any unpaid balances to date. All negative balance accounts will continue to receive weekly notices. All positive lunch balances will remain in student accounts and will be available when the waiver is no longer in effect.
