

No Cost School Meals Continue Through May 2021

About Money Smart Month:

In support of National Financial Literacy Month, the St. Louis Regional Financial Empowerment Coalition, a collaborative of local financial institutions, bank partners, non-profits and other community organizations throughout metropolitan St. Louis have come together to create Money Smart Month. Essay Contest Description:

- Students must submit a written answer of 500 words or less in response to the contest question.
- Submissions should be typed and double spaced.
