Reading Success Plans

Senate Bill (SB) 681 (2022) requires the administration of a state-approved foundational reading skills assessment to all students in grades K-3 to identify those who may be at risk for having an significant reading deficiency (SRD). Students will be assessed using the STAR assessment within the first 30 days of school to determine who qualifies for a Reading Success Plan.

What is a Reading Success Plan?

An RSP is a well-developed and defined plan to support students who exhibit a substantial deficiency in reading. Missouri legislation (Section 167.645, RSMo) specifically addresses student literacy and lists the requirements of an RSP. The development of an RSP includes the process of gathering and analyzing student data, determining if a student has a substantial reading deficiency (SRD), using data to set student growth goals, and assessing whether students meet those goals at the end of instruction. Students who receive an RSP must have evidence-based intervention reading instruction that is grounded in the science of reading.

An RSP is designed to monitor the specific skills needing improvement as identified through a state-approved assessment, dyslexia screener, teacher observation, or any other relevant student reading data. The teacher should use the identified skills to select aligned, appropriate, and explicit interventions as well as progress monitoring tools to measure growth.

Individual student MAP results will be provided to parents on August 25. Be checking Friday folders.

Chromebook Care

Parents will not be required to pay a Chromebook usage fee again this year. However, please be mindful that parents/students will be responsible for all damages and lost devices or accessories. Please read the Chromebook Handbook thoroughly for expectations and responsibilities for using school issued devices.

Devices will not be sent home on a regular basis with students in grades K-2.

Absences/Tardies

Strong attendance is critical to every child's academic success. Frequent absences and tardies not only disrupt your child's learning but also disrupts the learning process of others.

Please review the revised detention procedures and consequences for tardies starting on p. 31 of the student handbook.

Lead Testing

Get the Lead out of School Drinking Water Act (RSMo 160.077) which sets standards for lead concentrations in school drinking water goes into effect this school year. This Act requires schools to conduct inventory, sampling, remediation, and monitoring at all potable drinking water outlets used or potentially be used for drinking, food preparation, and cooking or cleaning utensils. You can learn more about the state statue <u>here</u>. Results will be published when testing is completed.





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Student Registration

Student registration for the upcoming year will be completed online. Parents can access the link on the district's website or <u>HERE</u>. All students-new and returning need to register online.

Our Student Handbook, Technology, and Chromebook agreements are available for parents to complete. Each student must have a signed agreement in order to access school technology. These agreements will be available during Open House.

Chromebooks will be assigned to all students in grades K-8. Only grades 3-8 will be taking devices home daily. Devices will be sent home for K-2 students in the event of inclement weather and the possibility of learning from home. Each device will have a bag to transport the device between home and school.

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MOCAP-Virtual Learning

The Spring Bluff R-XV School District is responsible for offering virtual education pursuant state statute, <u>162.1250</u> <u>RSMo</u>. Virtual learning is designed for families who prefer a non-traditional classroom setting. It is highly recommended that students in grades kindergarten through third grade attend school for in-person learning.

If you are interested in virtual learning through MOCAP, complete the application and submit to the school office. Once enrolled in a MOCAP course, students will be committed for a full semester to virtual learning.

MOCAP Application

Transportation

- → Bus pick up and drop off times can fluctuate daily due to the number of students riding on a particular day. We ask that students be at their pick up locations at least 5 minutes early and parents be at designated drop off locations early for this reason, thank you!
- → The high school bus leaves Spring Bluff School promptly at 7:15 am daily. High school students can be dropped off on the bus lot if they are riding the high school bus in to town. Students in grades K-8 should be dropped off at the back gym door beginning at 7:10 a.m.
- → If Spring Bluff School is not in session and Sullivan High School is, high school students wishing to ride the bus in will have to meet at Spring Bluff School at 7:15 a.m. since regular routes will not run. Students will be dropped at their regular stops in the afternoon.
- → Bus route times along with pick up and drop off locations will be available during Open House on Thursday, August 17th.
